Although only 16 years old, Alex created the beautiful watercolour paintings shown with this article.

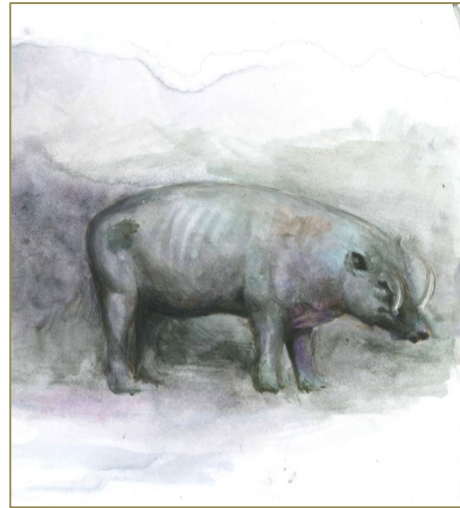
In her words:
